October has been a busy month for me, my office and the Constabulary. As crime has fallen again and more money has come to our county to tackle anti-social behaviour, the Chief Constable and I have been out across Cheshire hearing from residents as part of our 'Working Together' engagements.

## More money secured

In a hallowe'en surprise that should spook offenders, I'm delighted to have [secured an extra £1 million](#) to tackle anti-social behaviour in hotspots across the county. ASB is one of the top issues raised with me, and this extra funding will enable Cheshire Police to arrest more offenders, support more victims and prevent reoffending.



## Crime down again

The latest crime figures show that Cheshire has bucked the trend again with [crime falling by 3.2%](#), compared to an increase of 2% across England and Wales. Public order offences, arson, vehicle theft, criminal damage and violence against the person were among the types of crime which saw the greatest reduction.



## Women and girls

I have tasked an independent organisation, Victim Focus, to carry out an anonymous survey for women and girls aged 16+ in Cheshire. The results will help me and the police to understand how we can improve the services we offer. [Have your say by midday on Friday 1 December.](#)



## Working Together

The Chief Constable and I have enjoyed hearing from residents at the first five of our 'Working Together' events in each of Cheshire's Local Policing Units.
